Friends,

I forgot to mention that the two USTFIELDS meetings did happen on the 29<sup>th</sup>. It turns out that the 4101 Inca site may have no remaining problem. If the work that was done before the Stockton's bought the place is documented, there will be no need for further action. Apparently the paperwork was lost or not filed, leading the Colo. EPA to think that a problem might still exist. If this site turns out not to be a candidate for the grant, we can certainly nominate some other parcel.

The meeting at 4401 Tejon, which had the assistance of Denise Perez from Debbie Ortega's office (translation), seemed to clear up the issue that, yes, there are very likely still tanks in the ground.

Antolin Rodriguez, the only owner who was present, was enthusiastic about going ahead with the assessment. A release form granting access to the property for the environmental contractor is the next step. Communication lines are wide open; I'm optimistic that the project will go forward.
